

Oakridge, Oregon is poised for diversified and sustainable growth in a number of industries. With robust physical and digital infrastructure in place, and a stunning mountain setting, it is easy to see a bright future studded with tourism and new business. The nearby Eugene-Springfield metro area offers college town amenities as well as an educated workforce. A culture of entrepreneurship, and an inventory of land and workspaces combined with lower home prices adds to Oakridge's business allure. Other highlights include:

- Transportation: Oakridge is along Highway 58, a major East/ West trucking route; is near I-5; and just 53 miles from the Eugene Airport. There is also bicycle friendly round trip public transit from Eugene to Oakridge.
- Industrial space: The Oakridge Industrial Park is city-owned and has industrial and mixed-use land available for growing businesses.
- Top private employment sectors: Trade, transportation, and utilities; accommodation and food services; private education and manufacturing.
- Areas of growth include: Health; professional, scientific, and technical services; tourism; and information industries.
- **Communication:** Oakridge is served by all major carriers and has plenty of broadband bandwidth.
- Wages and housing: Wages are lower than the metropolitan area, but housing is more affordable.
- Education: Small school class sizes for K-12 with nearby access to Lane Community College, the University of Oregon and several small private colleges.


