
COVID-19 STATUS UPDATE



Positive case counts have stabilized



And so has test positivity...



But at a level too high to open K-12 schools for in-class learning...

Case counts are declining, but too slowly

 R_0 = number of new cases per positive case; needs to be below 1.0 to reduce transmission.

Two Choices to get case counts low enough to support sustainable commerce and in-person education across the state (childcare, K-12, higher-ed)

1. Local jurisdictions and businesses immediately increase proactive local enforcement efforts and improved implementation of current COVID-19 mitigation strategies

- OR -

2. State has to implement additional restrictions

Top actions that mitigate transmission with little or no economic impacts

- 1. Compliance with wearing face coverings
- 2. Compliance with OSHA guidelines for workplaces
- 3. Effective contact tracing
- 4. Compliance with <u>isolation/quarantine</u>, <u>including economic</u> <u>supports</u>

Other actions under consideration – many have economic impacts

1. Travel restrictions – range of options

- Mandatory quarantine upon entry/return to Oregon
- Restrictions on short-term rentals
- Enforcement by hotels

2. Restaurants/bars restrictions

- Smaller group size or family/household only
- Outdoor dining only

3. Other sector restrictions

- Close fitness classes
- Close gyms
- Close indoor event venues and entertainment facilities

Potential immediate actions requiring local jurisdiction and business support

Action	Potential immediate actions to support	
Compliance with <u>wearing face</u> <u>coverings</u>	Immediately <u>increase local enforcement and</u> <u>education</u>	
Compliance with OHA and OSHA guidelines for workplaces	Immediately conduct/expand <u>county inspections of bars/restaurants</u>	
Effective contact tracing	<u>Improved metrics in select counties</u> – more support, oversight, etc.	
Compliance with isolation/quarantine, including economic supports	Immediate improved connections between case investigators and local community-based organizations providing economic supports, including food, access to time-loss fund, etc.
