Commissioner Custer said if everyone around town wanted to build fences that are 5' that would create an issue that is why we have the police. You don't get to dictate security standards beyond what we have in the city, you can't build a fortress just because you don't like our police force, and we have to take that into consideration. We want nice looking houses, neat attractive yards and the fence height should be regulated.

Rick said we need to schedule another work session for the sign codes.
