h) Commission Discussion

Commissioner Taylor said we sent letters out to these people and then you reached out to the Oregon Health Authority that their application had been pulled. If we hadn't reached out to them would they have known or do they follow up?

Rick said we keep in touch with them.

Commissioner Custer said he understands that because of the developments in this, the conditional use permits process in the past hasn't necessarily been an issue, but now with the new industry coming and us not having any background, he thinks the city is much more in tune with the fact that we need to set up a calendar for conditional use permits so they know when the six month period is approaching or up so we can keep closer tabs, not just on marijuana facilities, anybody who has a conditional use permit.

Commissioner Taylor said she feels like we were almost bamboozled here.

Commissioner Custer said yes and no, he understands. In this case, no harm, no foul, we are still stuck with a dilapidated bowling alley, they own it but maybe someone will want to buy it.

Commissioner Taylor asked if we have the right to go into these businesses to check that they have the right ventilation and see how they are coming along?

Rick said with a conditional use permit we can go in and check, but they never let us in the building.

Dennis Patterson said he is aware that people are allowed to camp on site while a place is being renovated, does this mean now that the guy will quit camping behind the bowling alley?

Commissioner Custer said this was the first order of business and now we can look at any violations.

Rick Wiemholt 47699 W 2nd Street- This is just a suggestion for the conditional use permits, he owns several companies currently in San Jose and Houston Texas, conditional permits that were issued by the cities that he is in have very specific guidelines that have to be met during the period of that conditional permit. He has things that need to be done in 30 days, 60 days and the city comes in and checks that this is being done. It doesn't sound like you have that in place because you went 6-9 months without getting any feedback from them. He is given very specific rules and if he doesn't meet them then his permit is pulled.

Rick said this is not typical for CUP's in Oakridge, for example the only other ones that have CUP's are churches, gas stations and liquor stores.

Commissioner Custer said from now on you will see our CUP's will be more regimented. We walked into this with our eyes wide shut, we had a lot of big hopes for the town. It started to look like we were picking on marijuana industries and we quickly had to bring that in to ALL conditional use permits.

Commissioner Taylor said that some of the issue was that because this was a new industry and we had other government agencies to deal with and they were back logged, so that fell back on us too. She wants Mr. Wiemholt to know that if he does bring business here, we are not as lax as it seems we have been with this issue.

5.0 Discussion Items

Rick said on March 20th we are supposed to have our regularly scheduled meeting, do you want to have a meeting or have a work session for our sign codes?

The commission agreed to have a work session on the 20th at City Hall at 6:00 P.M.

Rick said we are working on the Transportation Systems Plan, we have a meeting tomorrow which we will choose the engineer to help us with that. We have three to choose from that were presented to us from ODOT. This will be a very long, drawn out process.

Commissioner Custer asked if there has been any feedback or discussion for the planning grant for the mill site project?

Rick said we have a meeting on the 27th of this month, he sent out some homework to everybody involved and he is waiting to get that back. This is for the OIP connecting trails, RV Park, Disc Golf and campground.

Commissioner Whitney asked if the public can be involved?

Rick said yes, just show up.
